



Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow is an active speaker and writer on the topics of faith, culture, race, parenting, technology, and pop culture. While he speaks to both religious and secular audiences, he is committed to living and expressing a life and faith that is beautifully complex, unimaginably just, theologically expansive, and excruciatingly kind.

Bruce's work with organizations addresses organizational systems, institutional change, and long-term visioning. His coaching with individuals addresses healthy leadership, work-life balance, and project start-ups. He has experience working with the Myers-Briggs Personality Type Inventory and The Enneagram; and is a Gallup-Certified CliftonStrengths Coach. He is a Senior Consultant and Coach with Convergence and has training in Organizational Transition Leadership

and Pastoral Care and Counseling. Bruce continues to advocate and provide training for hybrid worship and technology efforts across multiple denominations.

Bruce has been active in local politics and community organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area for nearly three decades including serving seven churches in various capacities as an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA) since 1995.

He has served on numerous secular and faith-based boards, including the Public Religion Research Institute; Parents for Public Schools, San Francisco; Filipino American National Historical Society, Santa Clara Valley Chapter; More Light Presbyterians; and Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity. He also hosts the podcast, BRC & Friends and has authored five books, most recently, *In Defense of Kindness: Why It Matters, How It Changes Our Lives, and How It Can Save the World* (Chalice Press, 2021) and *Everything Good about God is True: Choosing Faith* (Broadleaf Books, 2024).

A 1995 graduate of San Francisco Theological Seminary he was named the Distinguished Alumni Award in 2010 and in 2008 was awarded an honorary Doctorate from Austin College, TX. In 2008, he was the first Filipino American and youngest ever elected to the office of Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

A lifelong Northern Californian Bruce was born in Stockton, raised in Sacramento, lived in San Franciso for 30 years, and served in Palo Alto for three years. For now, Bruce, his spouse, and two pups are emptynesting in San Jose, CA.
